

IMS OPENING DELAYED



THE NISSAN AMERICAN SPEEDWAY FINAL

The Nissan American Speedway Final will take place Saturday, June 11th at the Long Beach Veterans Memorial Stadium and this year's race is shaping up to be one of the most exciting and competitive in the history of the event.

The field is made up of 18 of America's best riders and Canada's top two racers to total twenty in the overall competition. Of America's eighteen riders, nine are domestic and nine are overseas competing in England in the British League.

Of the twenty in the field only 5 can qualify and go on to the next round — The

Overseas Final at Coventry in England on July 15th. Those that get through that round go on to the Intercontinental Final at Vetland, Sweden on August 6th. The World Individual Speedway Championship's field is made up of those that get through the Intercontinental Final and the Eastern bloc's Continental Final. It's the biggest event of the year, of course, and this year the World Final will be held in Vojens, Denmark.

What makes the Nissan American Final so important is the fact that any rider who has any hopes of going for the World Individual Title has to qualify on June 11th or else wait

until 1989. There is no next day or next week. It's only next year. And that's what makes the racing so close and exciting at every American Final.

Add to that the fact that each event features five men all going for that all important win and the fact that in this year's race there are at least 15 riders who have an excellent chance to be one of the five that finish on top. And you can't discount the other five riders. Each one of them could be a spoiler, if not a sleeper.

This year's field is topped by Sam Ermolenko, last year's winner and the winner of the 1987 Ascot Long Track Championship. Former U.S. National Champion and former World Pairs Champion Bobby Schwartz figures to finish prominently, as does Flyin' Mike Faria, who is reportedly scoring maximums and near maximums in most of his British League meets. Both Kelly and Shawn Moran will be making their first stateside visits in many a moon and both are masters of the Long Beach track as is Lance King who has seldom encountered any problems there.


Both Alan Christian and Dubb Ferrell, two of speedway's real veterans, rode exceptionally well on the track at the Spring Classic and both could play a major part in the outcome. U.S. National Champion Brad Oxley, Steve Lucero and Eddie Castro all can fly on this big track, as can Ronnie Correy, Rick Miller, Robert Pfetzing and Gary Hicks.

Billy Hamill and Randy Green will be making their first ever appearances in an American Final, as will the two Canadians, Llen Dillon from St. Catherines, Ontario and Shawn Vanables from Mission, British Columbia. Although Billy is no stranger to the race track, Randy Green is, but he may have the upper hand because of his British League experience. If you watched the heat at last year's Ascot Longtrack race that featured Randy leading World Champion Hans Nielsen in 3 out of 4 laps you can get the picture. And, of course, Randy finished second behind Sam Ermolenko in the overall competition.

Who represents America on this year's World Championship trail will be decided on this big night. Don't miss this important race on America's only World Class speedway track.
