

SAM ERMOLENKO WILL RACE NISSAN AMERICAN FINAL

Sam Ermolenko's request to the AMA to excuse him from riding the Nissan American Final and seed him directly into the Overseas Final at Coventry in England has been denied. That means Sam must qualify through the normal channels. Sam had made the request because he wasn't sure if he could get a doctor's release in time for the American Final at Long Beach on June 2nd. That, coupled with the fact that as of press time, Sam had still not raced in any British League action - or any action for that matter - making his chances of being competitive in time very slim. Well, Sam has his doctor's release and his AMA license and he's been in intense training, although he feels he's going to have to limit that intensity in order to rest up for the June 2nd race. According to AMA officials, the concern in turning down his request was that if he was seeded directly into the Overseas Final, what would happen if he still couldn't race competitively? In that case, he would have taken the place of another rider who might have had a better shot at the World Title. Sam, of course, has been America's top rider for the past three years and won the Nissan American Final three years in a row. He's been in the World Final four times and finished 3rd twice. He's also won the Overseas Final twice. Our bet is that in spite of the fact that Sam hasn't seen any

competition for almost a year, he'll be as competitive as ever at the Nissan American Final on June 2nd at the Long Beach Veterans Memorial Stadium. Anyone who knows anything about American Speedway knows you can never count Sam Ermolenko out of the action!!!




NASHVILLE NETWORK TO AIR NISSAN AMERICAN FINAL

With Sam Ermolenko returning to head up the field at The Nissan American Final in Long Beach on June 2nd will be Shawn and Kelly Moran, Ronnie Correy, Billy Hamill and Greg Hancock. Sam, set to return to Wolverhampton almost any day now, still hasn't ridden a race this year. Both Shawn and Kelly are at Belle Vue and Billy and Greg are at Cradley Heath (where they share a house with former multi-World Champion Erik Gundersen). Ronnie, like Sam, is at Wolverhampton and to say he's been setting the British League on its ear is an understatement. He's been leading the League in averages most of the past two months, keeping his own in excess of 10 points. World Champion Hans Neilsen is in the lead as we go to press, but it's a distinct possibility Ronnie will be back on top as you read this. All six of these stars will be in the field at Long Beach and all six will be going after those precious four available qualifying slots. You can bet none of these riders will give an inch!!!


COLLINS WANTS TO RACE IN SO CAL

AMERICAN SPEEDWAY FINAL

The Nissan American Speedway Final will be held June 2nd at the Veterans Memorial Stadium in Long Beach. This year's event is shaping up to be one of the most hotly contested and competitive races in the history of the American Final as at least fifteen of the twenty riders in the field have an excellent chance of winning one of the four coveted transfer spots to the Overseas Final.

That doesn't mean that any of the riders in this all-star field are to be taken lightly. Even those that may not make the podium could well make a difference in the outcome of this race because, as any speedway fan knows, any rider can be an effective spoiler to even the very best.

Topping the field is three time Nissan American Final victor Sam Ermolenko. Ronnie Correy, currently

blazing with a top British league average, leads a strong field of overseas riders, all of whom figure to finish at the top in this race, which includes Shawn and Kelly Moran, Billy Hamill, Greg Hancock and Rick Miller. The stateside contenders are lead by current U. S. National Champion Bobby Schwartz and former U.S. National Champions Steve Lucero and Brad Oxley and includes Mike Faria, Robert Pfetzing, Lance King, Charles Ermolenko, Jim Sisemore, Ed Castro, Scott Brant and Tony Biernert. The field also includes two Canadians, John Kehoe and Fred Legault, both outstanding speedway riders particularly well known for their ice racing talents.

The Nissan American Speedway Final is without any doubt the most important event on the American racing calendar because it determines who will represent the United States in the World

Final competition. The top 4 riders who make it through the Long Beach race will qualify for the Overseas Final which is scheduled at Coventry, England, on June 24th and those that qualify there will compete in the Intercontinental Final at Fjeldsted in Denmark, on August 12th. The final stop, of course, is the World Individual Speedway Final, which will be held this year at Bradford, England, on September 1st.

The road to a World Final is tough, to say the least, but the fact is that it all starts at Long Beach on June 2nd at the Nissan American Speedway Final. Any rider who has any aspirations to be World Champion has to qualify there or else hang it up and wait until next year.

We don't want to tell you who we think will qualify at Long Beach and who will end up as America's representatives on the World Championship trail, but as we pointed out at the beginning of this article, at least fifteen of the riders have a good chance. If you realize that only four can qualify, you'll have a good indication of how competitive the action is going to be and you'll understand why this race will end up being one of the most incredibly exciting events of the year.

In addition to the racing, Mark & Brian, the KLOS-FM wild men of morning drive-time radio fame, will be on hand and it's rumored that they will engage in a spectacular stunt that involves the use of a U.S. Military Tank. Their stunt alone is well worth the price of admission.

Be sure and mark the date of June 2nd on your calendars, because this is one event you won't want to miss. Also, be sure to note that this is a new date for the Nissan American Speedway Final and not the date that was previously announced.

Tickets are \$12.00 for adults, \$5 for kids 12 to 6 years of age and kids under 5 will be admitted FREE. Tickets are now on sale at all Ticketmaster locations as well as every Friday night at the races at The Orange County Fairgrounds in Costa Mesa. For Visa or Mastercharge purchases call International Speedway at (714) 492-9933.

Additionally, tickets will be on sale at The Veterans Memorial Stadium in Long Beach at 3 p.m., the day of the races.

Gates open at 6:30 p.m. with the first race taking place at 8:00 p.m.





top speedway racing stars compete for the Fair Derby Crown.





The Nissan American Final on June 2 at The Veterans Memorial Stadium in Long Beach is the most important event of the year as far as anyone who is at all interested in an international title is concerned. For an American speedway

rider who has any hope of contesting the world championship title, he must qualify at this race or wait until 1991. 
