It is WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP time again and every rider worth his prize money in Britain will be out to make it his year for Gothenburg and the world final.

For CHARLIE MONK it must be a worrying period. Denied a chance at Wembley last year after an appeal, he has hit a bad run of mechani cal trouble this year which he must overcome by tonight if he hopes for a place at Gothengurg next September.

Last Friday against the Monarchs from Edinburgh, he began like the Charlie we knew of old with a win over GEORGE HUNTER in hea three. Despite another win in heat five, Charlie's bike played him up for the remainder of the match. It was the same story at Wimbledon last Saturday.

ALF WELLS has shown a remarkable form improvement since riding for Tigers. With any luck at all he could go far in the world title Likewise BLUEY SCOTT, WILLIE TEMPLETON and MAURY MATTINGLY. If only the Tigers can get their bikes going consistently, they should do themselves and the Tigers proud.

The opposition tonight will be tough. There is ARNE PANDER, the Scottish Champion, who rode unbeaten here on his last visit. There is RON MOUNTFORD of Coventry, ERIC BOOCOCK of Halifax, NEIL STREET of Exeter and many others.

The winner tonight will receive a SUNDAY MIRROR cheque and for full details of how this years World Championship works, read DON CLARKE'S column on the back page.

Last Friday was one of those nights for Tigers. True, we defeated the Monarchs, but if BENGT JANSSON hadn't broken an ankle in his first race it would have been too close for comfort. However, we won and that's the main thing.

What price BILL McMILLAN now? defeated both DOUG TEMPLETON GEORGE HUNTER in the trophy final last Friday. There is only decimal points deciding the reserve berth with Tigers at the moment. A promoter must ride his lowest average point scorer as reserve. He has no alternative.

The latest averages will include the away matches at Wimbledon and Exeter last weekend and from the way Bill was riding at Wimbledon he should be a certain team man next Friday when Tigers race Newport Wasps in the British league.

Newport will include GOTE NORDIN, the Swedish Champion, in their team next week. Nordin is one of the top three Swedish stars allowed to ride in this country. The others are OVE FUNDIN and BENGT JANSSON.

Our new Norwegian, JOHNY FAARFENG, is a fighter. Once he gets his bike perfectly tuned, he will be a star. He really has a go. He left London for Copenhagen on Tuesday to compete in a round of the World Championship out there and he will be back in time to race against Newport next week.

MAURY MATTINGLY had his bike tuned up especially for last Friday's match against Monarchs. He was so depressed by its performance afterwards that he took it down to Southhampton with him after the meeting and vowed to have it tuned from top to bottom for the second time in two weeks.

The S.T.V. gave us a good television showing last Saturday they tell me. I wasn't able to see it and neither were the Tigers as we were on the road to Wimbledon. The unexpectedly close finish made good viewing, but we must get those bikes going in time for the SCOTTISH CUP That is one trophy the Tigers intend to hang



WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP REVIEW

The 'Sunday Mirror' sponsored World Cham pionship competition that opens here tonight is loaded with cash incentives for the riders. It is also loaded with hurdles which any potential finalist will have to overcome before he reaches Gothenberg.

The winner of tonight's round will receive a cheque for £20 presented by BOB ALLISON on behalf of the 'Sunday Mirror'.

The semi-finals to be held at Cradley Heath and Halifax carry £30, £15 and £5 for the first three riders.

The British final at Wimbledon will carry £100, £50 and £30 and so will the British/Nordic final at Sheffield.

The European final at Wembley carries £250 £125, £75 and £25 plus £20 to each British rider who qualifies for the world final at Gothenburg, but is not placed in the first four.

32 riders qualify for the two semi-final rounds at Cradley and Halifax. 16 riders qualify for the British final, 8 for the Nordic final and 8 for the European final.

8 riders qualify from the European to the World final. It will be seen that the road to Gothenburg will not be an easy one, but for the lucky lads who get there, a pot of gold awaits.
