This is one of the reasons why both Eddie and I were willing to take a gamble on including Graham in the 1966 DIAMONDS, because we were tremendously impressed by the way he disregarded the odds in our round last year, and just got stuck in in each race. He may not be World Championship yet, but he's made of the right stuff.



It is a very strong field that will be contesting the points this evening, with Bill Andrew, Eric Boothroyd and Mike Broadbanks seeming to provide the main opposition for our own lads. However, I know that each and every DIAMOND will be in there doing his best to win through. They will as usual be relying on your vocal support, so lets all get with it and

really shout them home in every race.

Next weekend it is our pleasure to stage another of our special Speedway Weekends, with the Northumbrian Fours on the Saturday, and the first of our Northern Cup matches against Sheffield on the Monday. The Saturday meeting in particular should be very interesting, for in addition to seeing the top lads in action against each other, we are in for some real duels between the lesser lights. Each class of rider will only be racing against his own class, and races between keen youngsters like Ray Wilson, who has already represented England, and Johnny Dews and the rider who has set the Midlands alight, Brian Maxted, can be just as thrilling as those between Ivan, Brian and Peter. The secret is in the mixture, as my mother so often said, and the proof of the pudding is in the eating, so why not come along and sample it. The youngsters are the answer to Speedway's future, and this is their big opportunity to prove their worth. This will apply particularly to Dave and Alan, and maybe the choice of

The Road to Gold and Glory

What is it about World Championship racing that brings an extra keen glitter into the eye of every rider, and a sense of excited anticipation into the heart of the most blase speedway supporter?

The answer is quite simple. It is the knowledge that with courage and skill it is within the bounds of any rider to reach the dizzy heights which could result in him stepping

on to the winner's dais to be acclaimed WORLD CHAMPION.

Tonight you will see sixteen British riders start their trek towards World Championship gold and glory.

The reward will be hard earned. Make no mistakes about that.

From the 20 preliminary rounds now being staged on British tracks, only 32 riders from the original one hundred starters, can go forward to the two British semi-finals at Cradley Heath (June 13) and at Halifax (June 15).

Even when over these hurdles there are still two tough finals to be faced - the British Final (at Wimbledon on June 27), and British-European Final (at Sheffield on July 14), before the European Final is staged at Wembley Stadium, on Saturday, September 3.

And at Wembley the chips will really be down before it is decided which ten riders will go forward to the World Final, in Gothenburg, on September 23.

It is a tough road to ride. Tonight's sixteen competitors know that there can be no quarter given if they hope to walk out to battle as one of the sixteen European Finalists at Wembley

As well as glory, there are plenty of Sunday Mirror cash incentives to urge riders

to greater efforts in these battles.

Winner at each preliminary round will receive a Sunday Mirror cheque for £20, as well as his points money.

In the semi-finals Sunday Mirror prize money of £30 to the winner, £15 to the second and £5 to the third, can be won. Then the stakes get higher.

In both the British Final (at Wimbledon) and British-European-Final (at Sheffield) prize money jumps to £100 to the top scorer, £50 to the second and £30 to the third.

The bonanza comes with the European Final at Wembley. In addition to point and start money, further Sunday Mirror cheques of £250 go to the winner, £125 to the second, £75 to the third, £25 to the fourth, plus £20 to each British rider not placed in the first four, who qualified for the World Final.

When this cash has been safely tucked into the bank, successful Finalists then have

the Gothenburg World Final cash to look forward to.

Well, that's it! That is the glittering prospect within the reach of every rider tonight. You may rest assured that not one of them will let this chance of gold and glory slip lightly from his grasp.

GOOD EVENING-Another two away points under our belts, and we should now be in a healthier league position. The match at Newport was a cracker: and the all round team effort once again showed through. Right from the first heat, after a dispute about the exclusion of Newport's Ace, Gote Nordin, the DIAMONDS were in front, and not once did the opposition look like catching us.

Unfortunately the meeting was slightly spoilt by the attitude of Newport's manager, and our friend even yet, Ken Sharples. When Gote Nordin fell in the first race he bent his bike, and in an effort to get him into the re-run, Ken asked Ivan to lend him one of his machines. Ivan

rightly refused to do so on the grounds that although we are closely associated in Speedway this was a League took offence at the refusal and told the crowd over the public address of his feelings. This incensed the crowd who started to throw missiles at our lads in the Pits. This was wrong, and I hope that it will never be repeated, but the effect was only to spur our lads on to greater effort to prove themselves able to overcome the abuse. They were great, and you can be proud of the fact that not one of them retaliated in any shape or form, either on or off the track.

The following night at Swindon was rather a night of mixed fortunes, with both sides suffering from the 'gremlins' which get into a blokes engine and cause confusion throughout the meeting. We came within an ace of winning, but Lady Luck wasn't on our side that night though, and we had to come away empty handed. Special mention should be made, however, of Pete and Mike, who after taking a bad spill in the first heat, carried on for the rest of the

night although severely bruised, and both put up a creditable show.

Tonight of course all the bruises and 'gremlins' had better disappear, for it's the start of the biggest uphill struggle you can imagine. It is in the early rounds of the World Championship that the riders have to be extra careful, for then you get the little fish in the big pool causing waves when least expected. The top riders weigh up their opposition with great care, sorting out in each heat exactly who they have to beat to qualify. This is a dangerous practice for they overlook the man who although he may not have shone before in this competition suddenly finds the form he knows he has and bursts into the reckoning, and the stars have to do a rapid recount, if it's not already too late. Gordon Guasco of Wolverhampton was the lad who did it last year, who knows who it will be this year.

I reckon, and I have said this before, that there will be more than one surprise this

time, and I hope our lads provide their fair share of them.

Mike has already covered the extra meeting we have on Saturday, all I want to say is this. The second strings in Speedway are far underrated, and I believe that a meeting of riders of similar capabilities, no matter what that capability is, can be as exciting, Speedway wise, as the World Final. On Saturday we aim to give you the best of both, with thrills galore and trophies for the winning Four. Each team will be selected to represent a local district, and I hope you will all join in the fun, forget your favourite riders and shout for the team which represents your area. We have beeen asked numerous times to match our top lads AGAINST one another, and this is the chance we have been waiting for. Also of course there is that lesser, but vital battle between our reserves. Can you imagine the pressure such a challenge presents to these two lads. On one hand we have Alan, a local lad making great strides in Speedway, and on the other Dave, who has travelled 12,000 miles to claim back his team spot. You all know the trouble he took to get here, and you all know how much effort Alan has put into establishing himself. Who deserves the job? I don't know yet, and I am as anxious as they are to find out, The choice of reserve can win matches, especially away from home, so the best man must win. You can help by cheering on your own favourite, if you have one.

This is to be a meeting to be enjoyed to the full, and we look forward to it.

Next Monday however, is a different story. The Northern Cup begins in earnest, with the home and away battle with Sheffield. It will be vitally important to build up a large score in the first leg at home in order to be able to hold the TIGERS at Sheffield. This form of scoring eliminates all track advantage, and if we win this competition then we can rightly call ourselves Northern Champions. I think we can win it, and I think we will win it, but time will

tell I suppose.

Six weeks to go, and already the Russian Test looks like being a sell out. Judging by the demand for tickets it seems we will not have any left to send to other tracks, and visiting supporters will have to take their chance at the turnstiles. I hope you have made sure of yours by now. If not, I should if you want to get a good view of the RED RACERS face to face. See you all next Monday, EDDIE G.


