# SPEEDWAY CHAMPIONSHIP OF THE WORLD — 1967

(Sponsored by the SUNDAY MIRROR)

Thirty-two British riders, who have battled their way through to tonight's semi-finals of the World Championship Competition, sponsored by the Sunday Mirror, face another tough hurdle on the road to Wembley.

Sixteen of the thirty-two speedmen will be out to stake a claim in the British Final, at West Ham on August 15th, which can take them into the last six places in the World Final, at Wembley, on September 16th.

If the thirty-two semi-finalists think they have had a rough ride reaching tonight's semi-finals, here and at Sheffield, just wait until they go up to the starting tapes tonight.

The road to Wembley can be a killing course. Only eight top scoring riders from each semi-final can go forward to the British Final.

Once through to the British Final, the job of getting through to the World Final is made tougher by the fact that only the top six points scorers go forward to join ten Continental Challengers at Wembley.

Despite the odds, you can rest assured that tonight's challengers will be riding hell for leather. They know that the glittering Sunday Mirror prizes of £200, £100 and £50 at the British Final, and £1,000, £250 and £100 are within their reach.

The Continentals are also out for World Championship gold and honours.

The Scandinavian preliminaries have been settled and Ove Fundin (Sweden), Sverre Harrfeldt (West Ham), Lief Enecrona (Sweden), Bernt Persson (Edinburgh), Bengt Jansson (Hackney), Anders Michanek (Long Eaton), Gunnar Malmqvist (Exeter), and Ollie Nygren (Wimbledon), are through to the European Final, at Wroclaw, Poland, on August 28.

Iron Curtain challengers for the European Final will decide which eight go forward, to join the Scandinavian contingent, at Kempton, West Germany, on August 20, and this is how they will line up:

B. Samoradov, I. Plechanov, G. Kurilenko (Russia). T. Wyglenda, S. Ruarez, J. Trzeskowski, A. Woryna, P. Waloszek, E. Migos, A. Porgorzelski (Poland). J. Dinse, J. Hehler (East Germany). M. Werner, J. Holub, P. Mares, L. Tomicek (Czechoslovakia).

This is a tough field and whichever eight riders come out on top they will certainly give the Scandinavians plenty to do.

So the World Final picture is gradually falling into shape. Only eight weeks to go before the six British and ten Continental finalists clash at Wembley to decide who will wear the World Championship crown.

It will be a battle well worth watching. If you do not want to miss it fire in your application either to your local track or direct to Speedway Box Office, Wembley Stadium, Wembley (Middlesex.

# ACHIEVEMENTS—AND POINTERS

Sixteen riders. All aiming, some more optimistically than others, towards the premier individual honour our sport can offer. Only one of to-night's field, Barry Briggs, knows what it is like to win the title. Barry has appeared in every World Final since his debut in 1954, his fourth win in Gothenberg last September equalling Ove Fundin's all-time record—and provoking the Tranas Terror to come out of semi-retirement to try to make it five.

Including appearances as reserves Ken McKinlay has been in ten finals, and Nigel Boocock in six. Three times Ken has finished as high as fifth position, but Nigel has yet to get higher than seventh. Cyril Maidment has an odd record—he's ridden at Wembley, and he's ridden in World Finals. But never both together! Both his Final appearances being in Sweden!

Final debut only last year for Ivan Mauger, but he finished in fourth position, which was a more than encouraging start.

Trevor Hedge has got as far as the British Final—three times, in fact, with his 8 point total on this track last year as his best performance. Only one point behind Trevor last year came Roy Trigg, while Dave Younghusband managed a very uncharacteristic total of 2 in the same meeting. Reserve for last year's British Final, although he didn't get a ride, was Terry Betts.

Which means that the other seven riders to-night have never got further than this Semi-Final stage. But with the top eight at the end of to-night's racing moving on to the 1967 British Final at West Ham on August 15th some. at least, must have a reasonable chance of progressing further in the World Championship than they have ever been before.

But first, they've got to score something like nine points to-night—round Wimbledon—against pretty thoroughbred opposition. Round Wimbledon. That is the all important phrase. Transfer this Semi-Final to any one of the competitors' home tracks and the local hero would be pretty well sure of getting the required points to move on. Only Trevor Hedge had the luck of the draw to be drawn on his home track—the rest have to face the fact that they're competing on foreign soil. So how have they done round Wimbledon so far this year?

Trevor Hedge we'll ignore. His performances here are too frequent and too well known to detail in full.

Ivan Mauger has been here three times this year scoring 5-9-1 BL; 5-6-0 Test; 5-11 Internationale. Ray Wilson's three visits have produced 5-12-0 B.L.; 6-6-2 Test; 5-4 Internationale. While Terry Betts has 5-7-1 B.L. 3-3-1 Test reserve; 2-1 Internationale reserve.

Four riders have been here twice this year so far; Barry Briggs scored 4-11-0 in his British League match, and 3-5 while handicapped by injuries in the Internationale. Ivor Brown got 4-7-1 BL just last Thursday, and 5-3 in his World Championship Qualifying Round. Dave Younghusband has shown a liking for our circuit this season with 4-9-0 BL; and 5-11 in his World Championship Qualifying Round. Both of Nigel Boocock's visits have been for special occasions and he managed 5-4-0 Test and 5-9 Internationale.

In single visits for League matches Chris Julian scored 4-6-0; Mike Warkin

5-6-2; and Jimmy Squibb 4-4-0. Cyril Maidment came for his World Championship round and recorded 5-8; Roy Trigg looked in for the Internationale and made 5-5. And the other three, Geoff Mudge, Ken McKinlay and Alf Wells have yet to ride an official meeting at Wimbledon so far this season.

Note that where three figures are given they refer, in order, to rides-pointsbonus. Where only two are given they refer to rides and points in competitions which don't carry bonus points.

So there are the facts to work on. Analyse them and draw your own conclusions. See if you can forecast before the first race which eight will go through to the British Final. Then check up after heat 20 and see how many you've got wrong!
