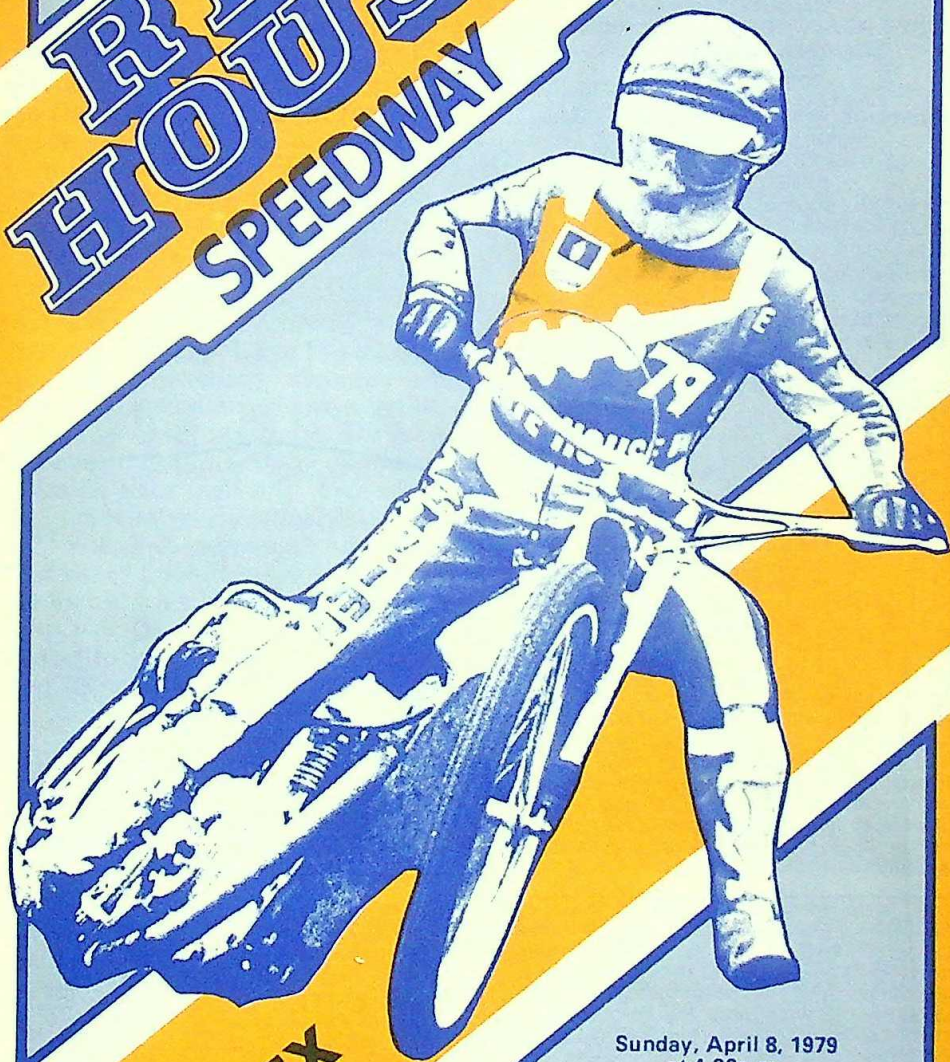

Today the **WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP** comes along, and with riders from the Gulf Oil British League mixed with the top riders from the National League we look certain to see some very good racing indeed, so we bid a warm welcome to them all, and to the supporters that they are sure to bring with them.

The last two rounds of the World Championship that we have staged at Rye have been lucky for us Rocket supporters, for in 1977 our very own Karl Fiala was the winner with a 15 point maximum, and last season Ted Hubbard did likewise, so can one of our lads win it today and made it a hat trick of wins for the club? Well, it would be very nice if one of them could, so let's see you get behind them and perhaps our wish will come true.

Since we joined the league in 1974 three World Championship rounds have taken place at Rye, so here are the results and scorers.

INGHAM'S INSIGHT

FIRST, an introduction. As well as being a member of the Daily Mirror Sports desk during the week, I creep into the corner of your TV screens on Saturday afternoons as part of Dickie Davies' team on World of Sport. But more important, I'm a local lad who has been hooked on speedway since the Rockets arrived here from Rayleigh in 1974.

Colin and Len have asked me to write a regular column this year, and it's a pleasure to oblige. It's great to be part of a winning team, even if it is in a "backroom" role, so let's start by considering our team's prospects this season.

The Eagles of Eastbourne have flown the National League nest, and League Rider's champion Steve Koppe will not be crusading for Canterbury this year. Does that leave the title track clear for our Rockets? Obviously it gives our chances a big boost, but even the most fervent fans know that nothing is ever easy in speedway.

One man who certainly won't be drawn into rash predictions is our skipper, Hughie Saunders. "I'm no Malcolm Allison," he said. "So if you want a forecast, ask again in October!"

But there was no disguising Hughie's enthusiasm for the new campaign. He's rarin' to go after a break in Guernsey and fitness-building sessions on the squash court, and he's hoping the team will carry on where they left off last year.

"All right, I know we lost to Eastbourne in the KO Cup final," he says. "But the team seemed to be going very well, and that is what we must try to maintain. If the established riders can continue last season's scoring, and if the youngsters can up their points by a little bit, then I think we'll be in with a shout."

Talking about shouting, that's just what the boys hope you'll be doing for them all this season — and if you are not too hoarse they are really going to need your support on Monday, April 9. That's the date of their Soccer match against Hoddesdon Town to raise money for mentally handicapped children.

The game is at Hoddesdon's Lowfield ground in Barclay Park, kick-off 7.30, so make a note in your diaries. Kelvin reckons that on the Soccer pitch he's worth at least twice as much as Nottingham Forest's million-pound man Trevor Francis. And with Len as coach, the Rockets can fall back on tactical skills if they run out of fuel!

Meanwhile, there are a lot of big dates to look forward to here at Rye — not least the visit of Exeter in the Inter-League KO Cup on Sunday, April 22. The fixture gives us more than a passing interest in the successful efforts of the Falcons to persuade their American number one Scott Autrey to forget about racing cars and return to the County Ground.

Exeter tell me their anticipated team is Autrey, Vaclav Verner, Jan Verner, Zdenek Kudrna (that name will be fun for Ted Sear!), Ales Dryml, Steve Koppe and Peter Prinsloo. Notice something? There's one American, four Czechs, one Australian, one Rhodesian — but NO Englishmen.

That line-up is going to make it a battle of different speedway philosophies on April 22, because the local talent that Colin has found and fostered is now playing such a big part in our plans. Admittedly, foreign riders are not allowed in the National League anyway, but I reckon Colin's attitude would not be any different if they were. Besides, just think of all those plane fares!

But Exeter have proved that their "United Nations" formula works, and with a spearhead who is currently number three in the world they are going to be a very big handful indeed.

During the coming weeks I shall be keeping you up-to-date with all the Rockets gossip as well as exploring wider speedway topics. I've a feeling that it's going to be a great season, and that means there is going to be plenty to write about.

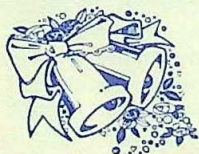

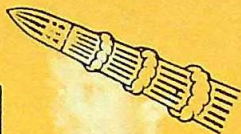

COUNTDOWN WITH MAUREEN



Whilst I am always eagerly awaiting the start of the speedway season, never have I been so happy to say goodbye to winter as I was this one! Surely we deserve a good summer in order to make up for it.

However, we did have one or two bright spots during those very hard months i.e., the dances and discos where we were once again all able to get together. Our thanks to those of you who attended, particularly those who supported our Fancy Dress disco — you certainly entered into the spirit of the thing and it was a hard task to choose the winners. Mind you, I think it is about time that someone told Colin that he can now stop the Max Wall walk!

For those who were unable to attend the A.G.M., there are one or two changes within our committee. Following the resignation of Peter Jordison, Audrey now becomes Vice Chairman and we also welcome new committee member Jan Orden. Jenny (previously coaches) will now be taking over from Audrey in handling our Riders Equipment Fund draw each week and Audrey is to assist Derek with coach bookings. For this purpose, Audrey's telephone number is Ware 650.

Whilst there are changes in the committee, I am happy to say that there are no team changes — a big "welcome back" to our 1978 team and we wish Ted, Hughie, Kelvin, Bob, Karl, Kevin and Peter all the very best for the 1979 season.

Last year we set out to gain 1,000 members and were proud to announce at the Dinner Dance that we did in fact pass that figure. Please help us to retain our record by becoming a member of the supporters club (40p adults, 5p children). Ron Gosling our membership secretary will be pleased to enrol you to-day.

One thing we would like to point out is that the club intends, given your support, to run coaches to all away meetings. However, to avoid the misunderstandings that arose in the mind of a handful of club members last season, we will only be booking ONE COACH FOR THE TWO OR THREE DAY AWAY TRIPS. The reason for this is that if the coach company were to charge say £150 for a coach then given that all 50 seats were sold the charge would be £3 per person! However, if two coaches were booked and only 25 seats were sold on the second coach it would be necessary to increase the charge. The committee feels that it has an obligation to provide transport to members at the cheapest possible price and to do this we must fill coaches. Our experience last year was that we were generally only able to fill one and a half coaches for the overnight trips. It is therefore for the reasons I have outlined that unless there is established an increased demand we will operate only one coach on a "first come, first served" basis.
