BOARDROOM BANTER



What a splendid start the boys have made to the new Gulf Oil British League season.

No matter what happened at Wimbledon last Thursday and Eastbourne the following night the competition that really matters is the league — and we could not have got off to a better start.

A win at Belle Vue followed by a comprehensive home victory against Hull Lada Vikings was exactly the opening of the new campaign that we had hoped for.

While we have to admit that Belle Vue are not the force they have been in recent years we do not think it will be long before they hit the winning trail and we are far happier to have gone to Hyde Road and earned a win then to have the trip still to come.

The same thing must apply to Hull who are among most critics' choice as potential

league champions.
With the first six matches over we boast an unbeaten record which in itself is not that important. What has been so pleasing has been the fact that we have already scored away wins at Poole, Belle Vue and Rye House.

All important in so much as it warns all opposing tracks that while the team may have undergone a few winter changes it is still going to be a powerful outfit.

Could anyone have had a better start to his British career than Zdenek Kudrna?

It's not so much the points he gets — but the way he gets them that has endeared him to not only Exeter fans but those of other tracks. It has always been our prime concern to provide the public with entertainment and

both Poole and Belle Vue are glowing with their appreciation of the way our side has entertained the fans at their tracks.

We can forget about the league and cup competitions for the next week or so as everyone turns to the World Championship and the parallel Grand Prix tournament.

This year the competition has three linked sponsors — the Berger Paints combine who are backing the Grand Prix in association with the Daily Mirror and their publishing stablemate the Sunday Mirror which again backs the British end of the World Championship.

Life's full of ups and downs if you are a speedway rider. Just ask Steve Koppe. After coming out in his first race and beating five-times World Champion Ivan Mauger so comprehensively you might have expected Steve to roar on to maximum points. Instead he slides off.

No-one's ever seen Scott Autrey quite so keyed up as he was last Monday night. He really was determined to beat the ex-skipper in that opening race and can there have ever been a better four-lap ride of the County Ground? Just when the Hull Lada Vikings number one thought he'd dealt with Scott's challenges our American superstar whipped round the outside. Truly magic!

Big problems next Monday following an almost - laughable - if - it - wasn't - serious decision by the Czechoslovakian government. They've cancelled next Sunday and with it the World Championship qualifying round at Slany in which both Ales Dryml and Zdenek Kudrna ride. All Czechs have been told to work as normal on the Sunday and instead have a three-day Bank Holiday starting on the Monday. With it the meeting has been put back 24 hours - so neither of the two Czechs will be able to ride in Britain that day. Exeter had already accepted the non-availability of Jan Verner (who is also in a championship round in Hungary) because Nigel Boocock is an obvious replacement. Vaclay, incidentally, has his qualifier in Germany on the Sunday and will be flying back that evening so will be racing in both the Gulf Oil British League matches with Reading.

What a trip for Exeter's away team manager Graham Hambly. Last Thursday morning he was one of the delegates at a

union meeting in Ayr, Scotland. And on Friday night he was with the Falcons at Eastbourne.

Sad to see Ipswich's Tony Davey so seriously injured in a crash at Leicester last Tuesday. He broke his thigh and could be out for the rest of the year.

* * * *

Confirmed: Scott Autrey as the May Golden Helmet Match-race Championship challenger. Likely dates for the contest between Scott and current title holder Peter Collins are Tuesday May 15 at Belle Vue and either Monday May 14 or Monday May 21 at the County Ground. Last year Scott lost out in a decider at Swindon after mechanical problems hampered his title bid.

Number eight Nigel Boocock is already a firm favourite at his new National League base Canterbury. He's had double figures in his last two meetings for the Crusaders — and finished fourth in last Monday night's re-arranged World Championship Preliminary round at Boston, beating Weymouth's Brian Woodward in a run-off.

Change of venue for this year's Berger Grand Prix Final. In the past it has been held at White City but this year it is switched to Wimbledon. But London White City isn't lost to the big meetings — the racing calendar includes three major World Championship meetings at Wood Lane — the Commonwealth Final on July 1; the Inter-Continental Final on August 5; and the World Team Cup Final on September 16. All of them on a Sunday and, hopefully, all including Exeter riders!

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

DAILY MIRROR speedway columnist GRAHAM BAKER looks at the Berger Grand Prix Tournament

The Grand Prix lives! And, indeed, Britain's top individual speedway tournament has emerged from a troubled close season stronger and more vibrant than ever.

It's four years now since the Daily Mirror introduced the Grand Prix with a novel method of points scoring that have an alternative to the straight forward knock-out principle of world championship racing.

Immediately, the tournament caught the imagination of the public and the top riders in the world.

Already Peter Collins, Ole Olsen and Chris Morton have won the Grand Prix title following three dramatic Finals at White City. This season the Final switches to Wimbledon on August 23.

But at one stage during the close season the future of the Grand Prix was most uncertain. Our joint sponsors Volkswagen withdrew after two years.

Happily, the situation was saved when the leading paint manufacturers Berger decided to fill the vacant sponsorship of the Grand Prix.

Already Berger back soccer's Isthmian League. This is their first speedway venture — and we are delighted to welcome them as cosponsors of the re-named Berger-Daily Mirror Grand Prix.

Their qualifying scores will be added to the Final premium points of 50 for first, 45 for second down to five for tenth.

It sounds complicated, I know - but it is the fairest possible way of deciding the top overall rider of the season.

I'm looking forward to the action — and I know that our friends from Berger will share the sentiment. I hope you all feel the same way.
