
Now then, what have we got in store at Groveway this season? Derek and Andy have moved on from last year's team, and Hurricane Harry McLean has returned north of the border.



#### IT'S a Long Road - - - -

FOR the first time ever, Groveway tonight stages a round of the **World Championship** and this is the start of the 'Road to Gothenberg' for all the riders taking part in tonights meeting.

The end of the road is the top spot on the rostrum in Gothenberg on September 6th and for once I hope the winner is not over 40, weak at the knees and from the other side of the world.

You'll have to forgive me 'Mr. Mauger' but as you have had every accolade bestowed on you during your magnificent career, I hope that one of our own English Lions wrests the title from you.

Coral racing have already opened their book on the World Final and are quite rightly naming *Scot Autrey* as 4-1 favourite. England's bright hope *Michael Lee* is joint second favourite with the 'Great Dane' *Ole Olsen* at 6-1.

The holder, Ivan Mauger and Californian whizz-kid Bruce Penhall are both 7-1.

At 10-1 you'll get money on Peter Collins, Dave Jessup and Billy Sandes.

Others involved in the betting stakes are: 12-1 Zenen Plech; 16-1 Edward Jarcarz; 25-1 Finn Thornsen, Jan Andeson, John Titman; 33-1 Phil Crump, Larry Ross, 50-1 and upwards the rest.

Which brings me very nicely to two well-priced outsiders. Having witnessed the Daily Express Spring Classic at Wimbledon recently I may well be tempted to slap a few pennies on Reading's *John Davis* or the Ipswich flier *John Lousis*. Both provided what little entertainment there was that night.

Having spent most of my early speedway spectating career at Oxford in the days of Ronnie Genz, Rick Timmo, Oyvind S. Berg and Norman Strachan etc., I was priviledged to see some great racing — usually from the away side, who normally tore the cheetahs to bits!!!

Passing, re-passing and ever re-re-passing was a weekly occurence and the fan's loved every minute of it. Those at Wimbledon (and their certainly was enough of them) were hardly warmed on a bitterly cold evening by constant processions from the gates.

There are a few probable reasons for this: a) these guys are the best and if they head from the gate, being the best they should not be passed b) they all realised that they have a hard and gruelling season ahead of each of them and they did not want to risk anything at such an early stage of the season. c) After a long winter both riers and machinery were a little out of practice and not at their best (when was the last time Peter Collins scored 4 points in a big individual meeting).

d) That the bread-and-butter of league racing is more entertaining to all of them.

Meetings like this ruin the image of the sport. With the ITV cameras recording the meeting I was greeted with the usual cry from the speedway illiterates at work "Did you see that speedway on TV? What did I tell you ... first one away always wins!"

Well as Knights fans will testify, racing at Groveway is racing and not a lottery. So the next time anybody sees fit to invite me to a so called "classic", don't bother, in my book National League rules O.K!!
