TODAY it's World Championship action at Rye, with **KARL, BOB and KEVIN** pitted against 13 rivals from both the British and National Leagues. This year we should see a real dog-fight, because only three riders from each of the five qualifiers can be sure of going through to the British quarter-final at Halifax on April 27. They will be joined by the highest scoring fourth man in all the meetings. One of the big threats to our Rockets' trio today is bound to be Hackney skipper **BARRY THOMAS**. Although "Thommo" celebrated a successful testimonial last season, he is still only 28 and on his day he can beat anyone in the world. If he misses the gate he is quite capable of battling through the field.

Those of you who witnessed our epic battles with Mildenhall last season will need no introduction to **MICK HINES** and **MELVYN TAYLOR**, both of whom have now moved on from the Suffolk track. Hines, who is 28 and has been racing speedway for eight years now, was recalled this year by his parent club Wimbledon. Taylor, 19 this month, was bought by King's Lynn for a reported £15,000 — and if he fulfils the potential he has shown so far he could be worth every penny. They should both be among the points today, and so could 19-year-old **TIM HUNT** of Ipswich, who looked so good on our track last season when he was on loan to Canterbury.

Don't rule out the wily campaigners like **LAURIE ETHERIDGE** (Crayford) and **BOB COLES** (Weymouth), who have had enough experience at all levels to settle in quickly and run up a score while some of the youngsters are still finding their feet. **BARNEY KENNETT** of Canterbury is another familiar face (especially to Kelvin Mullarkey!) and 25 year-old Barney's colourful approach to racing can be a winner on his day. Picking a winner today won't be easy, because the field is completed by men all capable of snatching victory for themselves: **PETE SMITH** (King's Lynn), **IAN CLARK** and **COLIN COOK** (Leicester), **DAVE PIDDOCK** (Canterbury), **JOHN HACK** (Oxford) and **RICHARD GREER** (Peterborough).

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AFTER THE MEETING.....

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From The Log Book With Dave Willsher

GREETINGS TO YOU ALL.

Today we stage a Qualifying Round of the World Championship, so we bid a warm welcome to supporters from all over the country, who are sure to be here to cheer on their own particular favourites, we trust that you all have a good day, but also trust that it is one of our Rockets that will end up the winner.

Last season we could not stage the meeting here at Rye, bad weather caused it to be switched to Hackney, which did not help our Rockets at all, for they lost the home advantage, and it was no surprise when none of them managed to get in the first three.

Mike Lanham of Ipswich was the winner with 14 points, Mike dropped his only point to Dave Gooderham in a thrilling heat nine. Dave Perks recorded a faster time than Bobby McNeil to take second place after both had scored 12 points.

And now as promised we will take a look at the details of our Rockets, starting with our **SILVER HELMET** holder, Karl Fiala. Karl had his first match in our colours away at Peterborough on May 30, 1975, he was number 8 and failed to score from his one start. Five weeks later on July 6, 1975, here at Rye against Bradford Karl recorded his first heat win, and it turned out to be the first of many. Almost a year later on August 1, 1976, Karl recorded his first maximum, which was a paid one of 11 paid 12, and it was here at Rye against Paisley. Since then Karl has recorded 21 maximums in league and cup, 9 full and 12 paid, last season he recorded 5 paid maximums, making 11 altogether, and I am sure that Karl will score many more maximums in our colours.

Karl became the first Rocket to win the **SILVER HELMET** when he beat Andy Grahame of Milton Keynes by two legs to nil, he won the first leg at Milton Keynes on October 2, 1979, by 2-0, and the second leg here at Rye on October 7, by 2-1.

Karl also became the first Rocket to defend the Silver Helmet successfully when he beat Ian Gledhill of Stoke by two legs to nil, he won the first leg at Stoke 2-0 on October 20, 1979, and the second leg here at Rye the very next day by the same score of 2-0.

A look down today's field tells us that it is not going to be easy for our Rockets, Barry Thomas is going well at the moment and must be one of the favourites, the same must be said of Mel Taylor, but for me the biggest danger to our Rockets is young Tim Hunt, Tim has gone full time with Ipswich this season, and I think the lad is going to shock some of the big boys in the top flight with his all action style, so we shall see if I am right or not.

Once again space has run out, so take care, and I will see you all next week when Joe Shaw will be here with his Ellesmere Port Gunners.

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INGHAM'S INSIGHT

WILL 1980 be Rye House's year in the National League after all the near misses of the past few seasons? We won't know the answer to that question until October, and few people are sticking out their necks with predictions this early in the campaign. However, by now we do know how most of the opposition is lining-up, so let's have a look at their strengths and weaknesses.

I'll have to start with Mildenhall, if only because they are the current champs. We won't dwell too much on that point, other than to consider their chances of retaining the title. Well, they've lost skipper Mick Hines, recalled by Wimbledon, and the brilliant teenager Melvyn Taylor, who has gone to King's Lynn. That leaves them with Ray Bales out of last year's top three, plus Robert Henry and Ian Gledhill and some useful second strings like Mick Bates and Mike Spink, and a crop of good juniors.

Producing enough of their own talent to replace the likes of Hines and Taylor won't be easy, and I cannot see the Fen Tigers doing it. Under skipper Henry they will again be tough to beat, but I don't reckon it will be their title again, even with new signing Ian Gledhill from Stoke. I'll list the Fen Tigers among my "dark horses" and go on to the two sides I believe could be the biggest dangers to the Rockets — Newcastle and Crayford.

Think of Newcastle and you think of Tom Owen. The Diamonds value him so highly that they have put him on a contract to cover the rest of his riding career. Their only worry must be his fitness, he broke a leg badly and missed the end of last season. But if it's the Owen of old in 1980, watch out! The Diamonds have added two Belle Vue loanees to their side, Derek Richardson and Keith Bloxsome. And since Newcastle boss Ian Thomas is, after all the England team manager, we expect him to have a good eye for talent. Of the pair I expect Richardson to be the more effective, but if Bloxsome makes the strides Thomas expects, Newcastle's all-round strength will be considerable, especially when you remember that they also have men like Aussie Robbie Blackadder and New Zealander Dave Bargh.

The Newcastle fans, like those here at Rye, have come to expect the best, and the riders are aware of what is required of them. At the end of last season Mr. Thomas announced that several of his squad wouldn't be invited back because they didn't measure up. It's a hard school in the North East, and it produces good speedway teams.

Crayford are a team so far without Newcastle's consistent record of success, and this could be the year that all that changes. At last they have a line-up of real strength and solidity — welcome news for those of us who relish a closely-fought "local derby" match. Crayford's big winter acquisition has been Les Rumsey from Oxford, and while we're expecting Karl to take the early-season wind out of Rummo's sails in the Silver Helmet, there's no doubting the man's talent and scoring ability. Too often in the past the Kestrels had to rely too heavily on Laurie Etheridge. Laurie is still very much around, although now he will be part of the back-up force to Rumsey (at least, that's the way I read it). Paul Woods and Steve Naylor were both on the point of breaking into the top flight last year, so if they start getting into double figures regularly quite a few opponents won't see the Kestrels' tail feathers for dust.

I've already said that Mildenhall are among my dark horses, and they are joined by Boston, Canterbury and Peterborough. Boston have been in the doldrums for too long, and they started this season with every intention of pulling out of them. I have always rated David Gagen, now back with the Cudas from King's Lynn. He's a big, aggressive rider who seems to dominate the track when he is going well. Robert Hollingworth appeared to lose his way when he left New Hammond Beck Road for Edinburgh, then all his old class began to return when he arrived in Cuda country again last year. Boston had added the much-travelled Chris Turner to their side, as well as Gary Guglielmi, and if they bring in the points they are capable of then the old excitement will start sweeping round Boston once more.

Any side containing Nigel Flatman has to be rated, and that is why I name Peterborough among my "possibles" — plus, of course, the fact that the big Alwalton track makes them so difficult to beat at home. Flatman, who is surely destined for big things with his parent club Ipswich, had a highly successful winter in Australia. Canterbury? Well, you can never write off the Crusaders, and we shall be watching with extra interest to see how Ted Hubbard goes back at his old base. I see it all finishing this way: 1, Rye House; 2, Newcastle; 3, Crayford; 4, Boston.

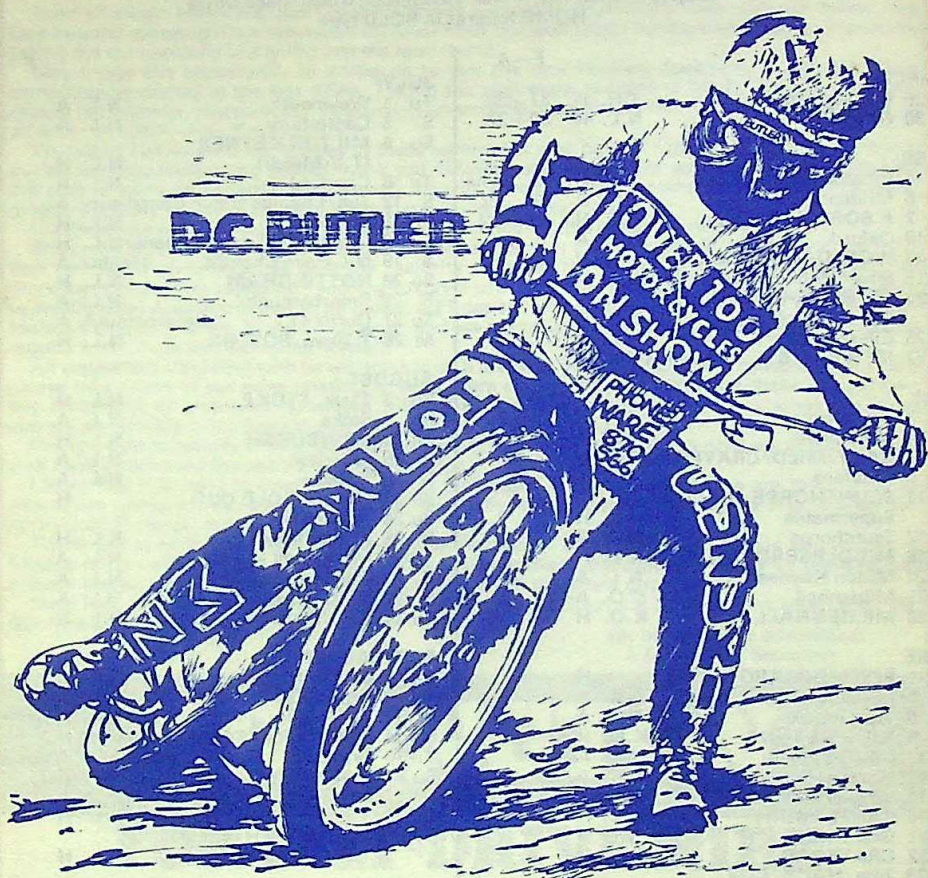
